



Admission requirements

Minimum academic requirements for Tshwane University of Technology

In addition to the National Senior Certificate (general or vocational), with a minimum of 7 subjects, a candidate must meet the following subject requirements for this programme:

Subject requirements

Subject	Minimum Score
Specific subjects: • English (home language or first additional language) • Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy	3 3
Additional subjects: Any other four (20 credits) subjects*	4 x 3
Total APS Score (Excluding Life Orientation)	18

**A candidate may have a score of two in one of the additional subjects as long as the final score still adheres to the minimum total score as stipulated for the programme*

Academic requirements for this qualification

- Applications will be assessed against all the admission requirements.
- Applicants with a final APS score of 22 and more, will be accepted. Acceptance is subjected to available capacity according to the Student Enrolment Plan (SEP).
- Applicants with a score between 18 and 21 will be invited to do the TUT-potential assessment (PA) test and can be considered for the Foundation Programme.

Duration

Three years of full-time study.

Career description

The institution undertakes to assist students with placement for experiential learning, or to do experiential learning on behalf of the student with accredited providers. A student should negotiate with the employer regarding conditions of service and other applicable conditions.

It is expected of students to complete prescribed practicals in the subject Community Recreation Management from the second year. Experiential skills learning programmes form part of the subjects Amenity Horticulture, Amenity Management and Outdoor Recreation.
