TUT suspends sit-in assessments at all campuses with immediate effect

Due to the continuous increase in positive COVID-19 cases in the country, especially in Gauteng and our very own University community, the Tshwane University of Technology Management has resolved to postpone the sit-in assessments and practicals in laboratories at all campuses with immediate effect. Online assessments will take effect, as per the approved Multi-Modal Teaching and Learning Strategy.

Students must take note that faculties will communicate further on how online assessments logistics will be implemented moving forward. As such, students are advised to always be on the lookout for announcements coming from their respective faculties and departments on the online assessments.

International students registered with TUT are also affected by COVID-19 and the restriction in terms of travel and contact time on campus. Provision for online assessments will also be implemented for this grouping of students.

The University would like to apologise for any inconvenience caused. Indeed your health and safety, as well as that of your loved ones is our priority. Keeping you safe, will help us to keep your families safe as well.

Students and staff must remember, the first step is to avoid the three C's – closed spaces; crowded places; and close contact settings.
