

GENERAL FACULTY RULES

At the Faculty of ICT the following rules apply:

1. A student may repeat any subject offered in any of the qualifications at the Faculty of Information and Communication Technology only twice. However, students currently registered for their foundation year, may repeat a subject only once.
2. Students must complete all subjects before registering for Industry Exposure IIB (this is not applicable to phasing-out programmes). Students with only one subject outstanding may be allowed to register for Industry Exposure IIB, with the approval of the Head of Department (please see all the fields of specialisation).
3. A change of specialisation can only be done once in a year. A student who wants to change his or her specialisation direction needs to submit a formal request to the Head of Department before the second Friday in October to be considered for a possible change in January of the following year. All heads of departments in the Faculty will meet shortly after this date to consider the merit of each case in order to possibly approve it.
4. A student who did not pass all the first-level subjects might be allowed to register for certain subjects in the approved IT specialisation field, however, the following rules will apply:
 - The primary registration will remain the general first year (NDIT12 or NDITF1) and second-level subjects will be added under the specialisation as a secondary registration. The primary registration will only change to the specialisation field once all the first-level subjects have been passed;
 - A student will not be allowed to register for any specialisation subjects if the student is repeating Development Software IA (DSO17AT);
 - A student will not be allowed to register for any second-level subjects if the student has three or more outstanding first-level subjects under the primary registration (NDIT12 or NDITF1);
 - A student will be allowed to register for a maximum of two second-level subjects (maximum 0,250 credits) under a secondary registration if the student has two outstanding first-level subjects under the primary registration (NDIT12 or NDITF1);
 - A student will be allowed to register for a maximum of three second-level subjects (maximum 0,375 credits) under the secondary registration if the student has one outstanding first-level subject under the primary registration (NDIT12 or NDITF1);
 - In the last two cases, the second-level subjects for which the student may register must be approved by the Faculty and the student cannot choose for which second-level subjects to register for.
5. It is highly recommended that students in this Faculty have their own personal computer or laptop in order to complete practical assignments and projects. The minimum requirements for this device are available on the ICT Faculty web page on the TUT website.
