Students:

- Register and pay for their Work Integrated Learning, before they receive a WIL guide (workbook/Logbook)
- Take responsibility for accommodation, relocation and transport during WIL
- Notify the University and Employer of change of address and other personal detail
- Ensure that WIL guide is kept up to date and signed by the mentor
